NSS Health and Social Care Programme held its second annual event following on from a successful inaugural event held by its Local Intelligence Support Team (LIST) in September 2016. The event titled ‘Shaping the Future: Intelligence for health and Social Care Integration – A Gathering’ was attended by 205 delegates and held at the fabulous Vine Centre, a community based charitable organisation, based in Dunfermline.

North and South Ayrshire Health and Social Care Partnerships co-hosted the event, having assisted with the planning. Video recordings of presentations were taken from Erik Sutherland and Bill Gray, from North

and South Ayrshire HSCP, Ron Culley, Chief Officer, Western Isles HSCP as well as Carol Lumsden from East Lothian HSCP on the theme of ‘Working in Partnership’. Maureen Falconer, Regional Manager for Scottish Office of the Information Commissioner gave an inspiring presentation on Information Governance as an Enabler asking the audience ‘Can we share – yes we can’. Final speaker on the day was Professor Sir Harry Burns, newly appointed Independent Chair of National Review of Targets and Indicators for Health and Social Care who delivered a challenging keynote speech highlighting the need to talk to each other, share experiences and take action.
